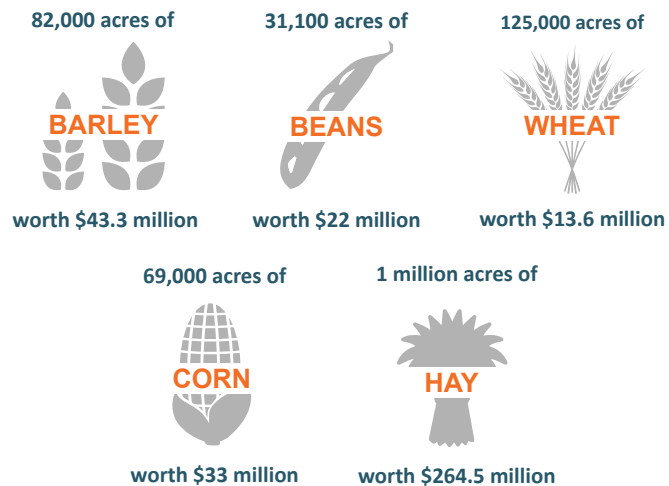
The state has 11,600 farms with the average size 2,600 acres.

Wyoming ranks

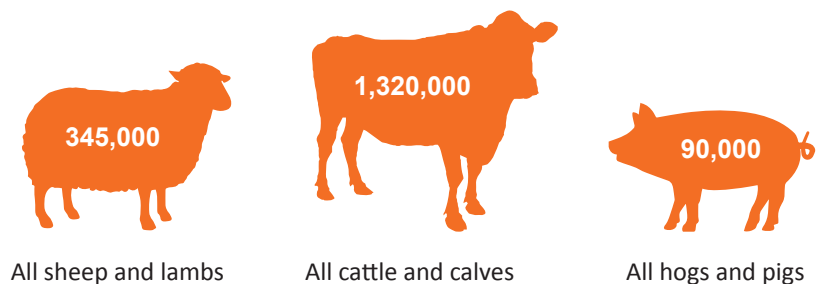

Farm Income

Total farm income in Fremont County is an even split between the value of crops and the value of livestock. The ratio is Hot Springs and Teton counties is about two-thirds from livestock and a third from crops.

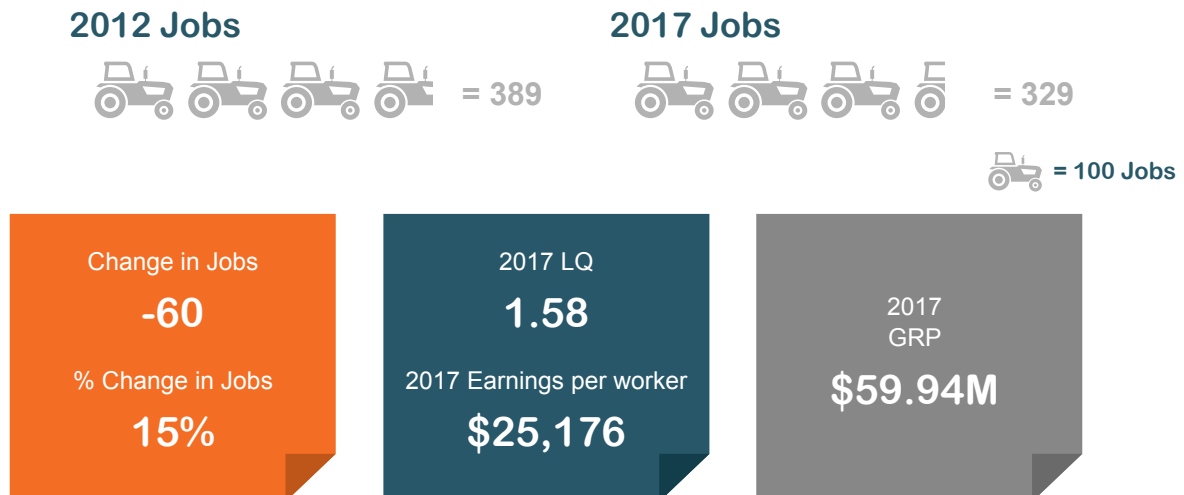
The number of farms is declining in the region, possibly due to the aging of farmers and ranchers.

Fremont County Agriculture Industry Characteristics

In Fremont County, agriculture ranked 18th out of 20 industries for earnings per worker in 2017. The sector lost 60 jobs for a 15 percent decrease between 2012 and 2017.



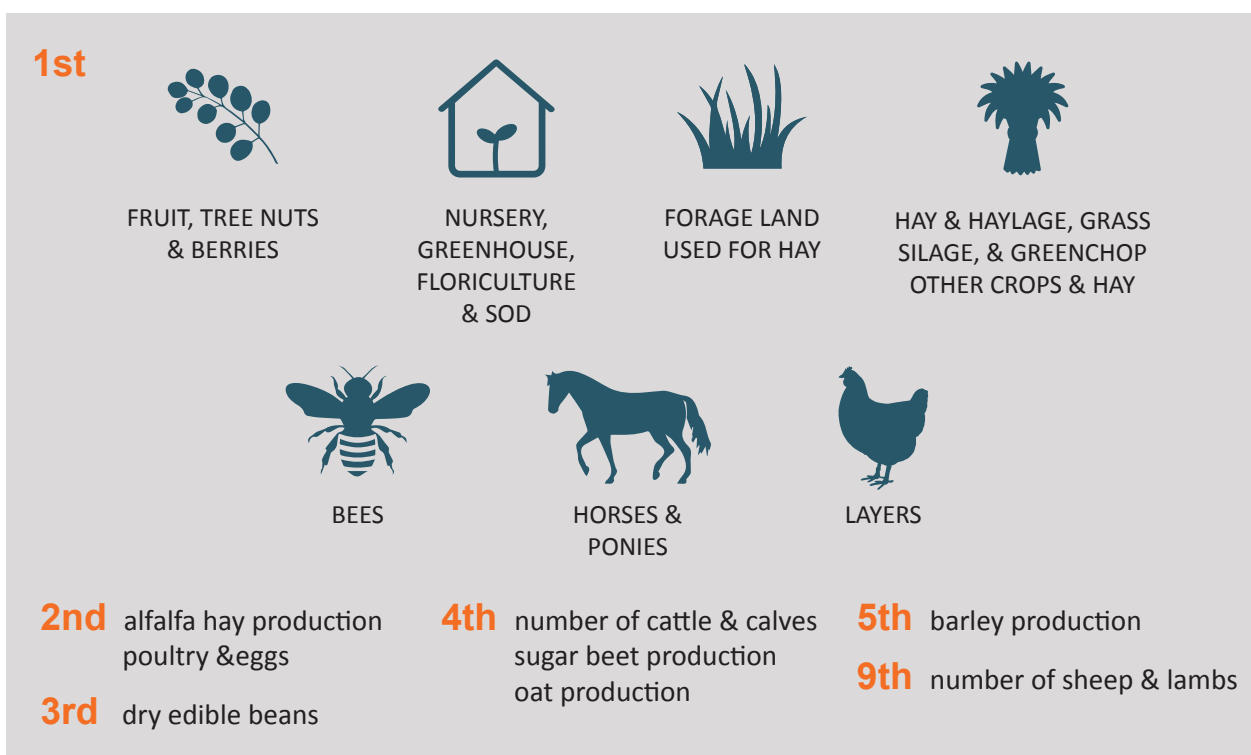

According to the five-year Census of Agriculture conducted by the US Department of Agriculture, 1,710,015 acres were used for crop and livestock production in 2012 with 88.1% in pastureland, 9.8% in Cropland and 2.1% assigned for other uses.

Top Commodities - Fremont County

Fremont County is well-known for producing top quality alfalfa hay, ranking in the top two counties in Wyoming for hay production. A fact that might not be as well-known is that Fremont county ranks ninth nationally for the number of horses.
